Talk About The Tiger Who Came to Tea

Use the names of characters in
the story during play and daily talk.

Tip: Think of new words

Boosting Speech & Listening Skills

- **Model, don't correct.**
Say new words clearly and
add another word (e.g.
"Tiger" → "Big tiger")
- **Follow their lead.**
Talk about what your child
is interested in
- **Use gestures and
expressions.** Point, act out,
use sound effects
- **Praise efforts!**

Activities for Language Growth

1. Tiger Toy Play

- Use a toy tiger or plush toy
to ask questions about its
actions or features (e.g.
"What is the tiger doing?")

2. Tea Party

- Role-play a tea party with
imaginary tea and pretend
snacks like cake or biscuits.
Ask questions "What's

3. Storybooks

- Read books with tiger characters
and point to pictures as you
name them or ask questions
"What's the tiger doing?"

4. Tigery Songs

- Sing songs like "Two Little
Tigers" and "The Tiger,
the Bear, and the Elephant"
What sound does
the tiger make?
